Harry's Highlights

Harry is the conductor of the orchestra; he stands in front of the musicians, shows them how to make the music, and encourages them to play beautifully. Listen out for Harry's favourite bits in the music...

Hansel & Gretel Overture by Engelbert Humperdinck

- At the beginning the French horns play some very gentle, beautiful music. What time of day do you think it is: morning time, lunchtime, or bedtime?
- See if you can spot the moment the music changes to an energetic dance, and listen out for the cymbals! CRASH!



Morning Mood by Edvard Grieg (from Peer Gynt)

- Listen out for birdsong, played by the flute and the oboe (members of the woodwind family).
- Can you hear the stringed instruments playing the same tune? We think it sounds like sunrise!



Hall of the Mountain King by Edvard Grieg (from Peer Gynt)

- The bassoons play the tune at the beginning. Do you think they sound funny or scary?
- Listen out: does the music get faster or slower?

The Death of Åse by Edvard Grieg (from Peer Gynt)

- The music is very still at the start. Can you hear the super low notes played by the double basses?



Troika by Sergei Prokofiev (from Lieutenant Kijé)

- Listen out for the sleigh bells. What time of year does it make you think of?
- Can you hear the string players plucking the strings with their fingers? We think it sounds like icicles. Brrr, chilly!

Anita's Dance by Edvard Grieg (from Peer Gynt)

- This piece is a waltz, which is a type of dance. Does it make you want to dance?
- Listen out for the magical sound of the triangle! TING!



Spring by Antonio Vivaldi (from The Four Seasons)

- Listen out for shivering strings, an accordion, and our amazing violin soloist Paula playing a lot of incredibly fast notes! WOW!



Dream Pantomime by Engelbert Humperdinck (from Hansel & Gretel)

- Do you remember that lullaby you heard in the first piece (Hansel & Gretel Overture)? See if you can spot it again!



Finale from The Firebird by Igor Stravinsky

- Listen out for the magical sound of the harp.
- Can you feel the music growing bigger and bigger?
- We love the brass fanfares and timpani at the end, and hope you do too!
